THOUGHT FOR THE DAY FROM LUCY: Being Kingdom-Minded

"I wish that all the Lord's people were prophets and that the Lord would put his spirit on them!" Numbers 11:29

Moses was chosen to lead the Israelites out of Egypt, and then all around the wilderness for 40 years. He didn't think he was good enough.

If you read Numbers, you might be tempted to agree with him: He had a stammer, and he was rubbish at delegating. Moses might have said the above words but he needed his father-in-law, Jethro, to point out that he was going to burn out.

"Why are you doing all this alone, with people standing here from morning until night to consult you?"

Moses thought he had no choice.

Jethro pointed out that God would be with him in choosing some capable folk to decide on all the smaller disputes. And it could be that some were better at it than Moses. That's not the point though, because any time we are tempted to focus on competition or comparison, we hinder ourselves from working with others.

The Holy Spirit can empower us to shrug off that temptation.

If God has gifted you to be a comforter, prayer, singer, cleaner of toilets, organiser, mentor, delegator, teacher, *smiler*, or all of these things, you will be prodded on when to use which one, when to share the load, and when to park it (no matter how good or bad you think you are at them).

Just ask.

How can you team up with others to serve God? Who can you support as they serve the Kingdom with their unique gifts?

Bible Reading for Easter Day: Luke 24 v 1-12

Jesus Has Risen

24 On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. ² They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. ⁵ In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? ⁶ He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: ⁷ 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.' " ⁸ Then they remembered his words.

⁹ When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others. ¹⁰ It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles. ¹¹ But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense. ¹² Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb. Bending over, he saw the strips of linen lying by themselves, and he went away, wondering to himself what had happened.
