The Ukraine Welcome Centre are eager to receive donations of coats, warm clothing and blankets.

Be a stamp collector for a good cause.

Collect stamps for RNIB and make a difference to blind and partially sighted people. If you receive cards and letters through the post, we'll turn them into funds to help people living with sight loss. You might make a good collection over the Christmas period.

We raise £20 for every kilogramme of stamps we receive.

Please ensure stamps are trimmed with approximately one centimetre of paper around the edge.

Stamps are sold by weight, so whatever you can send will add up to much-needed funds for our services. We accept all stamps: new or **used**, first or second class, foreign, first day covers, presentation packs or albums.
